Class Descriptions-L2

Nursery-Ages 0-2yr

This class is provided as a service for infants and toddlers whose parents are actively teaching or assisting in a class during period 1, 2 or 3. We expect nursery children to be with their parent **at all times** except when the parent is actively working on a team in a classroom. This includes Opening Announcements, before and after school, and the parent's off hour. You are welcome to stay in the nursery on your off period to enjoy the fellowship of other moms or bring your baby with you to the moms' fellowship area. Please pick your nursery child up promptly at the close of Class Day.

Preschool 3-5yr

These classes include a time of play, stories, circle time, music, games, crafts and movement for little ones whose parents are working at Class Day. A 10-minute snack time (parent provided snack) during the first class period is an integral part of this class. All preschool children must be potty trained. Each class will present a new and exciting opportunity to have fun and maybe get a little messy. Parents must prioritize picking up their children promptly at the end of class day.

Storytime

Preschool storytime is more than just fun - it is vital for developing foundational skills in young children. Listening and engaging in age-appropriate stories fosters a love of reading and learning in young students. We will read a variety of fun stories, do some crafts, and have a little creative play-time.

Movement

Get ready to move! We're going to play outside, go for walks, and play lots of fun games to get those wiggles out and stay active. **Parents: Please be sure to send jackets, hats, and gloves if it's chilly, because we will go outside as long as the weather isn't too bad.**

Music

We will introduce the kids to different types of music, and have instruments for the kids to play and learn about each week, changing the type each month(i.e. woodwinds, strings, brass etc). The kiddos will also learn briefly about a few of the great composers. And last but not least throughout the semester they will learn two songs, so four songs total for the year that they will perform in the opening gathering toward the end of each semester.

1st – 3rd Course Descriptions:

PE (1st-3rd)

This physical education class for 1st through 3rd graders is designed to promote fitness, coordination, and teamwork through fun and active play. Students will participate in a variety of age-appropriate activities, including games, relays, basic sports skills, and movement exercises that help develop strength, balance, and flexibility. Emphasis is placed on good sportsmanship, following directions, and encouraging one another. This class supports healthy habits while helping students build confidence and enjoy being active in a safe environment.

Parents: please make sure your student comes to class in appropriate closed-toed gym/tennis shoes, or they will be asked to sit out during the class.

All About the Body (1st-3rd)

Get ready to explore the amazing human body in this fun and interactive junior anatomy class! Students will discover how God designed our bodies to move, grow, think, breathe, and stay healthy. Through hands-on activities, games, crafts, simple experiments, movement challenges, and creative projects, students will learn about major body systems including the skeletal, muscular, circulatory, digestive, respiratory, nervous, and urinary systems. Each class is designed to make science exciting and age-appropriate while encouraging curiosity and healthy habits. Students may build body models, test reflexes, learn how the heart pumps blood, discover how food travels through the body, and much more!

Little Pilgrim's Progress (1st-3rd)

Pack your bags and get ready for an exciting journey! Students will travel with Christian through Children's Pilgrim's Progress as he leaves the City of Destruction and follows the path toward the Celestial City. Each week, we will read part of Christian's adventure, talk about what it teaches us about following Jesus, and connect the story to Scripture. Students will meet characters like Evangelist, Faithful, Hopeful, the Shepherds, and Giant Despair while learning about courage, faith, wisdom, perseverance and God's promises.

The Color Club (1st-3rd)

In this fun and interactive class students will explore the exciting world of colors that God created. We will explore it through art, science, literature, nature and everyday life. Learning about mixing colors, the color wheel, warm and cool colors. We will have hands on projects, activities, books. Students will develop appreciation for the beauty and purpose of color in God's creation and the world around them.

Brix & Blox (1st-3rd)

Use your imagination and creativity to explore a variety of uses for those famous colorful plastic building blocks called Lego. We will expand our depth of problem solving skills both individually and as a team. Get ready for hands-on fun while learning!

Gymnastics (1st-3rd)

1st – 3rd Course Descriptions:

Sticky Fingers Studio (1st-3rd)

Get ready to paint, glue, sculpt, and create! In Sticky Fingers Studio, young artists will explore a variety of fun art materials and techniques while using their imaginations to make colorful, one-of-a-kind masterpieces. This hands-on class encourages creativity and confidence through exciting art projects that are sure to leave a little paint on their fingers and a big smile on their faces!

Pioneer Tales & Crafts (1st-3rd)

Step back in time to discover the excitement of early American pioneer life. We will be combining lively American stories with hands-on crafting to bring the frontier spirit to life. Our young craftsmen should plan to learn many new skills in this class such as whittling, panning for gold, writing with quills, and making candles!

Where's Waldo? (1st-3rd)

Let's pack up and see the world with Waldo! In this class, we are going to hop a train, get on a boat or take a plane ride to see beaches, mountains, cities, lakes, and more. Along with some fun search and find, following directions, and cause and effect activities, we will have a few crafts and games to boot. Who says learning can't feel like going on vacation?

Story Art (1st-3rd)

Get ready to jump, roll, balance and have fun! Grab your apron and join us in Jr. Culinary Explorers! In this hands-on cooking class, students will create simple, kid-friendly recipes inspired by different regions and flavors from around the world while learning basic kitchen skills along the way. From sweet treats to savory snacks, each class will give students the opportunity to explore new recipes while practicing measuring, mixing, spreading, rolling, assembling, and safe food preparation.

Note: Students will need to bring a small cooking kit with common kitchen tools and supplies. A supply list will be provided before the start of the school year.

Exploring What God Has Made (1st-3rd)

Come learn about the six days of Creation with us! We will explore the things God has made through reading living books, doing fun experiments, engaging in beautiful poetry and doing some age-appropriate notebooking.

4th – 6th Course Descriptions:

The Blockitects (4th-6th)

We will use our creativity, problem solving skills, and imagination to build a variety of Lego projects in teams. Some classes will be introducing them to engineering and coding basics in groups of four. Students will have fun participating in Lego games, team challenges, and learn some of the history behind these incredible interlocking blocks!

Mediterranean Cruise (4th-6th)

Set sail on an exciting educational journey through the Mediterranean Sea! In this geography class students will “stop” at 10 different ports of call, such as Barcelona, Venice, Dubrovnik, or Alexandria. At each port we will learn about the rich local cultures, landmarks and traditions through some hands-on activities, maybe trying some authentic cuisine, or studying local art works.

Food Based Art (4th-6th)

Get ready to turn your favorite foods into amazing works of art! In this class students will explore drawing, painting, sculpting, and mixed media projects inspired by fruits, vegetables, desserts, snacks, and other food. Every project will combine art and a love of food in exciting new ways. No cooking required, just creativity and lots of artistic fun.

Zero to Einstein (4th-6th)

Join us as we zip and zoom through zany hands-on science demonstrations that feel a little bit like magic! Want to experience fun and fast experiments like Genie in a Bottle, Spinning Eggs, Dancing Dime, and Fire Extinguisher, while learning awesome science principles at the SAME TIME?!? If so, this class is for you! We will learn about air pressure, magnetism, electricity, chemical reactions and more as we fly through experiments that take our class from 0 to Einstein in 60 seconds!

PE (4th-6th)

Class sessions will include warm ups, stretching and various games/physical activities. The student will find emphasis on being active, trying out new activities, cooperating with one another, being a good sport and having fun with their friends. This class will encourage students to pursue healthy, active lives. They will take part in health-related physical fitness and team-building activities. Students will also learn the rules and skills necessary to play a variety of activities that foster positive social interactions.

Parents: please make sure your student comes to class in appropriate closed-toed gym/tennis shoes, or they will be asked to sit out during the class.

Art Fusion (4th-6th)

In this class we will be learning about many types of art, artists, and artistic mediums. We will be combining them into unlikely pairings to create some of our most interesting and creative projects yet! Think Rembrandt with a neon twist, or Picasso made out of pipe cleaners. The possibilities are endless!

4th – 6th Course Descriptions:

Daily Life of the Past(4th-6th)

Get ready to transport yourself back in time and walk in the footsteps of people long ago! In this class, students will dive deep into the daily lives of an Ancient Egyptian artisan, a Roman child, a Medieval farmer, a Pioneer family and more. Through immersive activities, they'll grind grain with traditional tools, churn real butter, carry water buckets the old-fashioned way, craft small tools and replicas, cook authentic historical snacks, and play games from each era. These engaging, sensory-rich experiences bring the past to life, helping students understand the challenges, routines, and ingenuity of people who lived hundreds or thousands of years ago.

Allergy Friendly Cooking (4th-6th)- **Supplies Required**

Equip your student with essential, real-world kitchen skills while fostering empathy for classmates with dietary restrictions. This course teaches students how to independently navigate a kitchen, handle tools safely, and cook safely for crowds. We will focus on mastering delicious recipes that omit gluten, dairy and nuts. If your child has other food allergies outside of gluten, dairy and nuts, please let us know so we can discuss on an individual basis if that will be a good fit for the class. Also, a kitchen kit will most likely be needed. We will update you before the semester begins on this.

Creative Spaces (4th-6th)-**Supplies Required**

In Creative Spaces, students will create fun décor projects for their rooms and homes. Using a variety of materials, students will explore different crafting techniques while developing creativity and design skills. Projects may include wall art, seasonal decorations, personalized décor, and other handmade creations students will be excited to display. ***Please note, parents will need to purchase a few additional supplies for this class.**

Lewis & Clark History & Nature (4th-6th)

The president has commissioned you to map and explore the United States' newest purchase, the Louisiana Territory! On the way, we are going to meet different tribes of Native Americans, journal the flora and fauna and learn to map and navigate as we follow the footsteps of the first Americans that reached the Pacific Ocean. **Note: there will be several outdoor days.**

Game On! (4th-6th)

There are thousands of games in the world; board games, card games, outdoor games, logic games, team games, solo games, the list goes on. Every class day we will play a new game (or two or three!). With almost limitless options, no game will be repeated. How many games can you play in a school year? Let's find out!

Readers' Theater (4th-6th)

Do you want the excitement of theatre without the stress of memorizing lines? In Readers Theatre the script is your best friend! Join us as we bring stories to life through expressive reading and group performance. Through fun scripts, interactive games, and theatre activities, we will develop reading fluency, vocal expression, confidence, and public speaking skills. Working together in a supportive environment, we will practice teamwork, creativity, and character development while preparing for a final performance at the Night of the Arts.

7th – 9th Grade Course Descriptions:

Drama Basics (7th-9th)- Homework Required

In Drama Basics, students will gain a general appreciation for acting and live performance. Students will learn simple acting techniques through drama exercises that will build their confidence and skill in speaking, listening, improvisation and memorization. They will practice narrating and re-telling stories. Applying what they learn in a short performance as part of the Night of the Arts in April. Homework will be required in the form of practicing their parts and memorizing lines.

Writing is Fun (7th-9th)- Homework Required

Dive into fun and interactive writing projects this year as we explore some of the exciting ways we use writing in our world. Students will create a newspaper together, develop a news show or video documentary, create their own blogs, write a fun story, and maybe even try their hand at playwriting, advertising, personal journaling, and more. We will tailor the projects to the interests and needs of the class. This class will encourage kids who enjoy writing to creatively try some new outlets, and help reluctant writers find a reason--and the courage--to share their voices. Students should expect to do a little homework most weeks so that they can successfully complete the projects, but this will not be a full writing curriculum.

Earth Science-Homework Required (8th-10th)

This laboratory-based earth science course covers the general properties of the earth's geosphere, hydrosphere, and atmosphere. Our labs will include mineral tests, rock analyses, fossil studies, density investigations, and magnetic property explorations. Students also get hands-on experience with waves, gases, wind, water purification, cloud formation, the Coriolis effect, precipitation, and acid/base interactions. Your students will complete ONLY the labs at Legacy, all other coursework will be completed at home.

NOTE to Parents: Our LABS are a Lab ONLY. A few experiments will need to be sent home. A lab report/notebook is required and will be graded weekly. Parents function as the student's primary teacher and are responsible for ensuring students complete all reading and for helping their student prepare for all tests and quizzes, which are given at home. The final grade for this course is given by the parent. Students should have a prior understanding of fractions and ratios.

Required: Jay Wilé's Discovering Design with Earth Science Package.

1 HIGH SCHOOL credit if all assignments, as stated in the book, are completed.

Bootcamp (7th-12th)

7th – 12th Grade Course Descriptions:

Ballroom Dance (7th-12th)

Ever been stuck doing the awkward “stand and sway” at a school dance? Or caught yourself staring at your feet instead of at your partner? This fun and energetic ballroom dance class is designed to help students move beyond common dance blunders and feel comfortable on any dance floor. Students will learn three exciting ballroom styles: a Rhythm dance like Swing or Push Pull, a Latin dance such as Salsa or Merengue, and a Smooth dance like Waltz. Along the way, they’ll practice partner techniques, timing, and dance combinations that can be adapted for school dances, parties, weddings, and other social events. The course also emphasizes dance etiquette, communication, and confidence-building skills to help students become successful leaders and followers. Whether students are complete beginners or already love to dance, this class offers a supportive and upbeat environment where they can build coordination, self-expression, and confidence while having fun.

Appetite for Adventure (7th-12th) **Supplies Required**

Let your taste buds guide you as we travel this great nation. This hands-on cooking class will guide you across our nation through classic dishes that have helped shape America. You will learn to master basic cooking skills while preparing classic iconic dishes. You will also leave class with your very own cookbook of A+ dishes ready to impress. This cookbook will feature well rounded recipes designed for when you are ready to live a more independent life. Join us while we build confidence in your cooking skills, grow basic culinary knowledge and step into a world of adventure with your taste buds. **You will need to bring a basic cooking kit required each week.** A welcome email prior to class starting will be sent out to Parents with description of needed items in your cooking kit. Teachers may also send a weekly email notifying Parents and Students of any further unique or special supplies needed for a particular class.

Chopped! for Engineers (7th-12th)

Each week our engineers will receive a STEM based challenge, like building a bridge or protecting an egg in a drop, and a mystery bag of supplies. Using only the mystery bag of supplies they will design a solution to challenge and put their design to the test. But, don’t worry, unlike the show Chopped!, no one will be eliminated.

LCA Media(7th-12th)- **Light Homework Required**

In this fun and fast-paced media class, students will learn the essentials of filmmaking—writing, directing, camera operation, sound, and lighting—by collaboratively producing an original short film. Students will explore real-world film crew roles while creating various reels and shorts for YouTube and Instagram. The class culminates in a final screening of the finished film for the school community during LCA Night of the Arts in April. Because this is a highly collaborative, action-oriented class, students must be focused, ready to participate, and committed to weekly homework. This course is designed for students eager to work hard and create media as a team. **This class will likely require a few meetings outside of class time to ensure project completion.** Dates will be sent later this summer.

Fiber Arts (7th-12th)

Using yarn, fabric, wool, and more, students will create handmade projects they can be proud of while learning to manipulate materials creatively, developing their artistic skills and personal styles.

7th – 12th Grade Course Descriptions:

Service Squad (7th-12th)

Service Squad is a class in which students will focus on serving our community through different service projects and of course visiting our friends at Hemsley House. This is a class that will help students develop an understanding of community needs and build on the spiritual gifts that God has given them to serve others. Please dress for the weather on the days we'll be walking to Hemsley.

Intro to Speech (7th-12th) **Light Homework Required**

Develop confidence, communication skills, and leadership through the art of public speaking! In this engaging course, students will learn how to organize and deliver effective speeches while developing valuable everyday presentation skills through a variety of speaking opportunities and fun class activities. We will explore a variety of speech formats including storytelling, impromptu, persuasive, devotionals, interviews and more!

***Homework will include light preparation for speeches in advance.**

PE (7th-12th)

Class sessions will include warm ups, stretching and various games/physical activities. This class will encourage students to pursue healthy, active lives. They will take part in health-related physical fitness and team building activities. Students will also review the rules and skills necessary to play a variety of sports.

NOTE to Parents: This course could be used in conjunction with at-home fitness instruction or sports, to fulfill one (1) Physical Education Credit for your student's high school transcript. And please make sure your student comes to class in appropriate closed-toed gym/tennis shoes, or they will be asked to sit out during the class.

Money 101: Financial Literacy for Real Life (7th-12th)

This class is a guide to understanding money before the real world hits. In Money 101 we will cover topics such as budgeting, saving & investment, borrowing, debt, taxes, banking and more. Students will learn with the help of fun videos, written work, and hands-on activities. From creating your first budget to learning how the stock market works, this course turns "boring money stuff" into practical skills they will actually use.

The Tech Toolkit (7th-12th)-**Computer Required**

Unlock your laptop's full potential and become a confident digital pro ready for college, work, and beyond! Students will build essential real-world skills through hands-on lessons, smart workflows, and exciting projects where they can use their creativity while they learn. Gain practical tools for organization, communication, troubleshooting, and more. No prior expertise needed, just a computer and curiosity.

Eat Smart, Live Strong (7th-12th)

Ever wonder if energy drinks actually give you energy, why athletes eat the way they do, or what your body really does with the food you eat? In this fun and interactive course, based on 101 Nutrition by Debra Raybern, you'll uncover the science behind food, fitness, health, and everyday choices. Learn how nutrition affects your mood, energy levels, athletic performance, and long-term health while exploring popular food trends, nutrition myths, and real-world health topics.

9th – 12th Grade Course Descriptions:

American Literature (9th-12th)-Light Homework Required

Let's celebrate America's 250th birthday by exploring some of the country's greatest literature! We'll begin with the Puritans as we read *The Scarlet Letter*, and continue through history with other favorite works: *Narrative of the Life of Frederick Douglass*, *My Antonia*, *The Great Gatsby*, *Unbroken*, and several short stories. Each class period, we'll enjoy discussions and activities that help us dive into the world of the books. Between class periods, students will read the assigned chapters, and may have a little homework some weeks as well, including preparing a short presentation once or twice during the year. By completing the reading, participating in class, and working through occasional assignments, students will earn approximately 1/2 credit.

Definitely *NOT* How to Get Away with a Crime (9th-12th) Homework and Curriculum Required

This course helps your high schooler explore a career in forensics by teaching them how clinicians use medicine to solve mysteries and interact with the criminal justice system. If your student is interested in a career in lab, field or clinical forensics, this course will expose them to the foundational concepts. Through hands-on analysis and real-world case studies, students bridge the gap between healthcare and law enforcement. They will discover how medical professionals evaluate evidence to find the truth. 1-2 hours/week of homework required. Textbook required: *Intro to Forensic Science*, Masterbooks <https://www.masterbooks.com/intro-to-forensic-science>

NOTE: Before taking this course, it is important that parent/guardian/student are aware of the topics covered as part of this course. Courses in forensics include **content warnings** because they cover sensitive, graphic, or potentially upsetting material—we encourage parents/guardians to attend this course along with your student. If all work is completed, this will count for 1 high school science credit.

ASL 2 - pre-requisite - ASL 1, or similar ASL experience (9th-12th)- Homework and Curriculum Required

This intermediate course expands upon the fundamental language skills and cultural awareness gained in ASL 1. Students will advance their receptive and expressive abilities through immersive, visual-gestural communication. The class emphasizes real-world conversation, complex grammatical structures, and a deeper exploration of Deaf culture, history, and community values. We will be using the same curriculum as last year.

The Art of Discernment (9th-12th)

This discussion-based class helps students think critically, discern wisely, and develop Christlike character as they navigate today's culture. Using the Five Common Topics, students will learn to evaluate ideas and apply Biblical truth to topics such as identity, relationships, technology, success, stewardship, purpose and more. Through guided discussions, Biblical reflection, and thoughtful consideration of differing viewpoints, students will tackle a topic each class day, and strengthen their ability to discern as they seek to discover and apply Truth. We will cultivate virtue and develop a deeper Biblical worldview, all while having a great time!

9th – 12th Grade Course Descriptions:

Biblical Principals & Active Civics - American Government (9th-12th) Homework Required

Skip the dry lectures and boring textbooks! Biblical Principles & Active Civics is a high-energy, “flipped” classroom experience where high schoolers learn the facts at home so they can run the government in class.

Between our bi-weekly meetings, students spend 1–2 hours watching fast-paced videos, listening to brief podcasts, and exploring what Scripture says about justice, stewardship, and human nature. When they step into class, they instantly apply that knowledge by jumping into fast-paced simulations. Your student will draft bills in a Mock Congress, argue constitutional rights in a Mock Supreme Court, and manage international relations during an Executive crisis game.

Equip your teen to understand our nation’s structure, stand firm in a Christian worldview, and become an active, faithful steward of their citizenship.

Parent Role: Parents retain grading authority; a complete syllabus, bi-weekly student home checklists, and participation rubrics are provided to make tracking hours effortless. If all work is completed, this will count as the required 0.5 credits for a government class.

Acrylic Art Studio (9th-12th)- Supplies Required

This hands-on high school art course introduces students to acrylic painting through a variety of techniques, styles, and artist-inspired projects. Students will complete a painting each class while exploring color theory, blending, texture, composition, layering, and creative expression. Throughout the semester, students will study influential artists such as Vincent van Gogh, Claude Monet, Andy Warhol, and Georgia O’Keeffe, using their techniques and styles as inspiration for original artwork.
